Labrador-Grenfell Health encouraging residents to get COVID-19 vaccine at pop-up clinics including Roddickton-Bide Arm area

Labrador-Grenfell Health is encouraging residents across the region to receive their first and second doses of the COVID-19 vaccine. Although COVID-19 may occur in the Labrador-Grenfell Health region, high vaccination coverage will help protect individuals and communities.

COVID-19 vaccination is available for all eligible residents, which includes everyone 12 years of age and older.
