Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder (FASD) Multidisciplinary Diagnostic Clinic

Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder (FASD) is the diagnostic term used to describe the range of disabilities and diagnoses that result from drinking alcohol during pregnancy.

Individuals with FASD may experience:

- learning difficulties
- · behavioural difficulties
- issues with problem solving, organization, memory, communication, auditory and visual skills

Early diagnosis provides individuals and their families the opportunity to access services to meet their needs, leading to enhanced overall well-being and improved outcomes.

The Labrador-Grenfell Zone FASD Multidisciplinary Diagnostic Clinic provides assessment and diagnosis. Clinics alternate between Happy Valley-Goose Bay and St. Anthony, and provide services throughout the region.

A referral is required for assessment, and is accepted for individuals 8 years of age and older residing in the region. Anyone can make a referral.
